He helped cheer up the patients as they waited for their family doing treatment as well.

On December 09 the doctor told Sharon she was good with the cancer and could go back to Brazil but should have regular check-ups. We called the airlines to reschedule our flights. We had to purchase a round trip ticket for both of us to come out cheaper than using our return and paying the difference. One airline gave us half of the return back and the other airline gave us a full refund. On December 18th we will be flying back to Brazil and hopefully arrive at our house in Boa Vista at 1:00pm on December 19th.
