A special thank you to everyone who prayed and inquired about our oldest son Stephen. He was told on his birthday last May that he had cancer and immediately had surgery to remove the cancer and some lymph nodes. His medical team thought they had removed all the cancer until this winter when the doctors did not like the look of his lymph nodes and sent him to MD Anderson in Houston for more tests. His employer agreed and transferred him to Houston so that he could work as he was able and keep his job. The good news is that after a biopsy it was determined that the cancer is still in remission. We give all the praise to God for His goodness and covet your continued prayers on his behalf.

From Kunming China we ask you to be in prayer for team leader Mark Alexander, who has just released, through the local market for online book browsers, an e-book titled "Trying To Make Sense Of Life." It is directed toward non-Christians and so far it has seen a serge of interest. Since this is a new and un-tried way to witness, we are praying that people (non-Christians) will read this e-book and that their hearts will be open to God as a result. We also ask you to pray that the local authorities will not interfere with the distribution of this material. You could liken it to a tool used to repair soil before seeds are planted or pre-evangelistic. This is very similar to the pre-evangelistic programs – like Moments of Melody – used in our ministry in Spain. It prepares hearts to receive the Gospel message. Keep in mind, as you pray, that this is the first time in China, as far as we know, that this type of witness has been allowed in the public marketplace.

Please pray also for the Siberian Bible Conference that will take place in late March. As of this writing, there are 28 pastors and full-time workers planning to attend. The problem they face is obtaining travel documentation needed by each of the Christian workers from the local authorities.
