It turned out this consisted of one semester in Manchester, England. He was able to endure the meeting with pain medication. Every time he would bite down on solid food he would feel a shock of pain. Upon returning back to Kunming, China he went to his local dentist and a crack was found in a earlier crown and worse the remains of a broken needle which must have snapped off during root canal work.
