He asked me to preach the funeral and I gladly agreed. There were a lot of unsaved people at the service. There is a taboo among the Navajo regarding speaking of death, but that taboo is lifted when a person passes away. We always preach a plain gospel message at funeral services. The Lord blessed and around 10-15 people raised their hand indicating they were putting their faith in Christ. Pray for Bro. Jimmie as he deals with the unexpected loss of his son. He did rejoice in that God used his son's death to bring eternal life to others! I am so glad that God can turn ashes into beauty! Thank you for praying and standing with us!
