We only had a foot, but it made things an awful mess. All across the Reservation people have been stranded. Our parking lot (unpaved) has been a nightmare, but that's just how it is! It is the worst I have seen in our 20 years here. Naturally, our attendance was down, but I was really proud of how many of our people braved the elements to come out.



SOMETIMES THEY COME TO YOU

I received a phone call from Curtis, a young man that I had worked with before in election here in Apache County. I had not seen him or heard from him in a long time. He was frantic over the phone. Through the nasty mud he came and met me at the church. We began to talk about where he was at in his life and he surely was not in a good place. For over an hour we visited and I began to tell him of the One Who could change his life. It was incredible to watch Curtis repent and put his faith and trust in our blessed Lord! He has been attending the services, so pray as we work to disciple him and help him overcome his life challenges.

SOMETIMES THAT TRACT CAUSES THEM TO COME TO YOU

Do you ever wonder if anyone ever reads those tracts you pass out? This story is amazing. In November, my wife and three of the ladies from our church went to a conference in Albuquerque. On the way back, they stopped to eat at the Denny's in Window Rock, Arizona (our Tribal capital). As my wife is always faithful to do, she gave the waitress a tract along with a very good tip. Just two weeks ago, several months after she was given the tract, Amy showed up at Ganado Baptist Church. It turns out that she lives just a few miles from

us. After the preaching on that Sunday morning, she came to the altar and one of our dear ladies, Mrs. Hollifield, led her to Christ! Amy has been faithfully attending services. Pray for her husband who needs to be saved.

SOMETIMES WE GO TO THEM

God has blessed us with a wonderful nursing home ministry. We pick up two

men each Sunday to bring them to church. One was Roy Bitter. Because of the muddy roads, we were unable to get to the nursing home for four weeks. When I got there to pick the men up, the staff told me Roy was in the hospital and not doing well. Bro. Ryan Nez, church planter out of Ganado in Window Rock, joined me for the visit. Roy was laboring to breathe, but glad to



see us. I asked him about his salvation and he indicated that he was not sure about Heaven. He speaks English quite well, but Navajo is his first language. Bro. Ryan took over and in just a few minutes, Roy was saved! They moved Roy from the hospital to a hospice unit in Flagstaff. I am so glad that God allowed this ministry and gave us the opportunity to tell him how to receive Christ. Roy's last name is Bitter, but his heart is now anything but bitter! What a Saviour! Thank you for your part in the salvation of these folks. There are many more to be reached and discipled. Pray for us as we endeavor to follow the will of God in reaching the Navajo Nation.

THE PASTOR AND HIS FAMILY

The most sacred trust a pastor has is his family. As goes the family, so goes the church. No church is any stronger than the families that make up its membership. The devil is out to decimate the family and destroy the home. If Satan can destroy

the family, he can impede the progress of the church; if he can impede the progress of the church, he can weaken the structure of the nation; if he can weaken the structure of the nation, he can destroy the foundation of democracy.

Pastor, God is not only IN your family's future, He IS your family's future. Your family is of utmost importance to God. He loves your family immeasurably, and He proves it every day by preserving, protecting, and providing for each member.

The family is the basic unit of society, and long before there was a church or a school or a government, there was a marriage, a family, and a home. God Himself performed the first wedding in the Garden of Eden when He united Adam and Eve (not Adam and Steve) in holy matrimony. This is God's plan: one man for one woman. His plan cannot be improved upon. It must not be changed, challenged, or circumvented. Same sex marriages insult God's integrity and fly into the face of a thrice-Holy God.

At the celebration of Henry Ford and his wife's fiftieth wedding anniversary, someone asked him to what he attributed their fifty years of matrimony. He answered, "I use the same formula as I do in making cars: stick to one model."

What shall it profit a pastor if he wins the world and loses his own children. Dr. J. Frank Norris said:

"It matters not what we preach or what our achievements; if our home life doesn't back it up, it is a most colossal calamity." Dr. B. H. Carroll wrote:

"Young gentlemen, if you have on your side--first, God; second, your wife; and third, your conscience--you need not fear anyone, not even the devil himself."

God is the designer of the family, and He has a plan for the head of the family to follow. His plan includes the following:

- 1. BE AROUND. If you are not around to guide and protect your children while they are young, can you expect them to be around when vou are old?
- 2. BE AVAILABLE. Listen to them when you counsel or correct them.
- 3. BE ACQUAINTED. Don't be a stranger to them.
- 4. BE AFFECTIONATE. No "cold fish" relationship.
- 5. BE AGREEABLE. There are two sides to every encounter.
- 6. BE ALIVE. No "dead pan" relationship.
- 7. BE AUTHORATATIVE. Lay down the law without executing the defendant.
- 8. BE APPROACHABLE. Keep a short distance between you and your children.
- 9. BE ATTENTIVE. Even in the smallest matters. (What is small to you may be large to your children.)
- 10. BE AWARE. Don't sleep through their aims, accomplishments, and ambitions.

GROWTH IN EVERY WAY Norris Bible Baptist Seminary has been in a resurgence mode in seemingly every way possible these nearly three years. In its expansion of core curriculum, enhancement of facilities and furnishings, financial support

and in the size of its student body it is increasingly reemerging. The school is debt free and has operated in the black since 2014. The future has never looked better. To God belongs all the credit. Our IBFI churches, pastors, missionaries, faculty, administration, and student body look to Him for everything we have.

FIVE GRADUATES THIS MAY

We have five candidates for graduation this semester. Of course, every one of them has a story that becomes increasingly meaningful to the faculty, administration, and student body as we see them nearing the end of the semester.

Floyd Cabler, in his early fifties, sets off how NBBS has always been characterized by students of all ages.
