6. *Be alive*—Why is it that the preacher can be the center of attention at an assembly or gathering, and be a wall flower at home—a dead-pan with his children. Wake up, and show other churches attended creating a full auditorium. Our church vourself alive to your family.

7. Be authoritative—you can be authoritative without being dictatorial; you can be terse without being a tyrant, and you can exercise control without being a commandant.

8. *Be approachable*—Many children have turned to a neighbor or friend because they discovered that their preacher-daddy is unapproachable. You can maintain dignity without being distant. Open arms send a better message than clenched fists.
