## WHAT IS NEEDED TODAY

In so many words, J. Frank Norris said many years ago—in relation to why the Bible Baptist Seminary was started in 1939—that what was needed was a school that teaches the whole English Bible, that is free from modernism, that will take a man from the engine cab, from between the plowshares, and teach him the Bible, and in so doing, equip him how to go out with a Bible under his arms, faith in his heart, and in the power of the Holy Spirit begin in a vacant lot and build a church to the glory of God.

Some 85 years later, drivers, engineers, and farmers, may still readily be taken from the road, rail, or field (from behind a truck, train or tractor), and prepared to preach the word, win souls, and to build churches, if it is the right kind of a school. Drivers, engineers, and farmers are ready-made potential students for ministerial training. The idea is that they leave a profession already begun in order to follow the Lord (like Peter, James, John, Andrew, and Matthew of old), having learned much from their vocation which can be refined for use in the ministry by a thoroughgoing Biblical course of study. One wherein all sixty-six books of the Word of God are taught consecutively, as found in the Bible

discharged from the military entered the BBS. They did so to fulfill a commitment to God that was cultivated by what they had seen and experienced while involved in the greatest conflict of modern times for the future of the civilization. Soldiers today can find the same kind of place in a school like the NBBS wherein not only men right out of high school who have sensed a call to the ministry, but also many in their late 20s, as well as their 30s 40s, and 50s, or older, make up the student body

Is a Bible, faith in it, and the power of the Spirit sufficient? Yes. ven in a world which is increasingly high-tech, nothing is as cutting-edge as the Bible. A book, that in the hands of the Spirit, pierces "to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit"something no man can do! By its very nature, it will always be the most advanced, yet settled presentation of truth there will ever be.

What can be more modern than a book of timeless truths given by an eternal and all-knowing Creator? Because God is outside of time and sees the past, present, and future all at once, He can impart truth that is ageless. Therefor nothing could be more state-of-the-art and up-to-date than His Word. It is proactive, prescient, and penetrating in its message in ways no other writing could ever be (Psalm 119; Galatians 3:8; II Timothy 3:16-17 – "throughly furnished"). The "old-time religion" is actually the "all-time religion" (even an ongoing relationship with God).



Accordingly, the better one is taught the Scriptures in Bible school, the more relevant will be the training—as in a school like NBBS, in which 44 of the 48 courses of study are in Bible, theology, church ministry, and living the Christian life, Of which, 24 of these courses are direct Bible exposition wherein all the books of the Bible are taught as they are found. An institut

which now permeates our society (which in essence is the idea that tr is relative, that there is no one truth for everyone).

Nothing will prepare a preacher for 21st century ministry like a grounding in the Bible's contents, teachings, doctrines, and principles!

Who better to do so than a faculty made up of like-minded preachers as your pastor, as at NBBS, who are also active in

The Indestructability of the Word of God

In Mark 13:31, Jesus said, "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my word shall not pass away." The Psalmist wrote in Psalm 119:89: "Forever, O Lord, thy word is settled in heaven."

The Psalmist also wrote in Psalm 12:6.7:

"The words of the Lord are pure words; as silver tried in a furnace Of earth, purified seven times. Thou shalt keep them, O Lord, thou shall preserve them From this generation for ever."

Let it be known that the Word of God cannot be duplicated, replicated, eradicated, exterminated, or invalidated. No book in the history of the world has been attacked so viciously as the Word of God has been attacked. However, it has outlived all of its critics, and has remained the best seller of all times and is ahead of the next so-called best seller off the press.

In the country of France, there is a monument to the Huguenots, who died as martyrs, that has this

"Hammer away, ye unregenerate hands: Your hammer breaks: God's anvil stands."

A well-known hymn by Haldor Lillenas:

"The Bible stands like a rock undaunted Mid the raging storms of time: Its pages burn with the truth eternal And they glow with a light sublime. 
Down through the years, men have burned it, botched it, belittled it, banished it, blasphemed it, butchered it, banned it, and buried it, but never destroyed it. ## "Riding the Rails of Truth"

We are on the verge of our 40th graduation. The year of 1984, when NBBS started, does not seem that far away to me. I came to Ft. Worth to go to school in 1978, to further prepare for the ministry.
