Constance Ann Nixon, 83, Baldwin, ND, passed away on March 31, 2017, at her home. Constance "Connie" was born on June 5, 1933, in Fort Scott, KS, to Howard C. and Helen (Kent) Holt. She grew up in Uniontown, KS, and attended Uniontown Public Schools. Following high school graduation in 1950, she attended the University of Kansas.

Connie married Charles Abram Nixon at Goddard, KS, on September 12, 1951. Four sons, Charles Curtis (Susan), Thomas Bradley, David Keene (Karen), and Christopher Lewis (Tina), and three daughters, Trudy Lynn (Wendell) Allen, Lisa Anne (Glenn) Sparks, and Laurel Marie (Joe) Weaver were born to this union.

In December 1978, Charles and Connie, following the leading of the Lord, moved to Mandan to begin their ministry to the Indian tribes of North Dakota.
