## The Value of the Eternal Soul

Our Lord has given us a most urgent command.

Geography, politics, and culture will all come to an end; but the souls of men and women and children will continue to endure. And they will endure in God's blessings thorough the Salvation that is in Christ, or they will endure in a lost, depraved, and deteriorating condition separated from Christ. There are but two Bible revealed destinations for the soul, **Heaven or Hell.**

Let this truth motivate us to follow in the footsteps of Jesus Christ to seek and to save that which was lost. Pray for those that are preparing for the mission field, and also for those whom God is calling; but have yet to surrender to the call. Pray that God will empower and embolden our missionaries as they confront their limitations and their fears to trust God for the victory.
