Looking For and Hasting Unto

Questions are often asked concerning God's calling on our lives. No doubt, many are called. There is a difference between God's calling and God's choosing. God's calling and direction can be different for each of us, and yet, there should be similarities with that of the disciples. Mark 3:14 ... that they should be with him, and that he might send them forth to preach

All Christians are called to have a personal relationship with God through his Son Jesus Christ and the indwelling Holy Spirit. We should consider it a privilege to tell others about Jesus Christ. We can grow and progress in our ability to serve Jesus. We will receive direction on where we should be serving the Master. Some will receive special callings to preach. Some will fill prominent positions in God's work. Some will be ordained as the disciples were. Some will be sent to distant lands. God's work is of utmost importance, and each position is necessary and important.

For me, I sensed God's call on my life at a young age. Over a period of years, I came to considered the end of the matter. I decided that living for Eternity required exactly that. *Looking For* required *Hasting Unto*. No matter what others do, I must make some changes in my life: I surrendered my life to God's will, I came to the altar after a church service, I told my pastor that God had called me to preach, I enrolled in Bible School. After a year, I resigned my engineering career and went to Bible School full-time and took a position at my local Church. 2 Peter 3:11-13 summarizes what happened to me during that time.

¹¹Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought ye to be in all holy conversation and godliness, ¹² Looking for and hasting unto the coming of the day of God, wherein the heavens being on fire shall be dissolved, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat? ¹³ Nevertheless we, according to his promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness.

Looking for and hasting unto. This is Peter's recommendation to us. I followed Peter's recommendation over 41 years ago. I have never gotten over it. If you haven't already done so, I recommend it to you.
