Elihu's Plea in Times of Darkness

“Teach us what we shall say unto him; for we cannot order our speech by reason of darkness. “ *Job 37:19*

As I read the book of Job, I can't help but see him as the teacher and preacher figure to the three friends and Elihu. I believe that Job must have been their mentor and their teacher. Their theology may have been based on his theology. Their prosperity was result of his investment in their lives. Their knowledge of God was the result of his relationship with God and his relationship with them. In Job's affliction and the resulting confusion, all of this was in the balance. As the three friends argued with Job, Elihu listened; and as time went on, his frustration only increased. As his time to speak came to an end, Elihu gives his plea to Job, “Teach us what we shall say unto him.” This was still Job's greatest responsibility to them. They were still dependent on Job in their relationship with God, and it was this relationship that was most important to Elihu.

Our times today are similar. As Christians, preachers, and missionaries, we have our trials, our losses, our questions and our arguments; but, as they may consume our attention, there are still those around us who are dependent upon us if they are to receive the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. Their plea to you is “Teach us what we shall say unto him.” The next time you find that your own situation consumes all of your attention and your energy, remember Job and Elihu's plea.
