The land of Mexico is the largest Spanish speaking country in the world. Within the country of Mexico, there are thirty-one states and one Federal District, Mexico City. Each Mexican state is diverse, having customs, foods, and historical traditions of their own. My family and I are sent out by Worth Baptist Church in Fort Worth, Texas, to Guanajuato, Mexico. The state of Guanajuato is located in the north-central part of the country and is known as the heart of Mexico.

The Lord has directed us to the town of San Miguel de Allende with a population of 160,000 people. We are in the process of getting to know the town along with working on the permit that I need to live and work here in Mexico. There are many denominations and religions here. Roman Catholicism is the major religion in Mexico, as

well as, here in San Miguel de Allende. Wherever we go we see the crosses, the idols, the prayer cards with pictures of the saints, and the shrines. Upon our arrival this past summer, we visited with a small Baptist congregation on the outside of town. We were able to assist in their Vacation Bible School, and we rejoice for the four souls that were saved. Our desire is to begin a new work among the people to reach them for Christ and to establish them in the faith.

We have started three Bible study groups meeting with different families during the week. The Lord continues to bless as they are learning God's Word. We continue to make other contact with people in stores, parking lots, hospital waiting areas, and just wherever we can meet people to share Christ. Please be in prayer for us as we seek the Lord's direction in locating a place to fellowship and hold church services, Bible clubs, and prayer meetings. Also pray for us as we seek the Lord for guidance, wisdom, spiritual and physical strength.

We want to say "Thank You" to all the local churches that support and pray for us and for allowing us to be part of your mission program.

# Are You **Ready?**

This is an important question that we have to consider many times each week in our lives. Are we ready...for work, ready...to eat, ready...to preach, ready...to pray, ready...to (you fill in the blank.)

Paul declared that he was ready to preach the Gospel in Romans 1:15 and that he was ready to be offered to the Lord in death in II Timothy 4:6. The Lord warns us to be ready for His coming in Matthew 24:44. Peter declared that we are to be ready to give an answer to every man, and Paul wrote to Titus to be ready to every good work.

The people in our society that must be ready at all times are referred to as "first responders." Among these servants, we would include medical personnel, policemen, military, and air traffic controllers. In the spiritual realm, I hope we realize our "first responder" responsibilities as preachers, teachers, soul winners, missionaries, Sunday School teachers, and bus workers.

Jesus was a "first responder" to our needs when He left Heaven to come and die the awful death at Calvary. He was ready to die, willing to die, and suitable to die for our sins and the sins of the world.

Let's keep ourselves battle ready, awaiting the next opportunity to be a "first responder" for the Lord as He dispatches us to someone's aid in the battlefield.

## From the Pen of the President Emeritus

### SCRIPTURAL FORMULA for HANDLING TROUBLE

I. David's Discouragement—Psalm 3:1,2 Three reasons the Psalmist was discouraged: A. Increased enemies—verse 1 B. Multiplied troubles—verse 1 C. Abundant criticism—verse 2

Discouragement is a common denominator of life. No one escaped the heaviness of a discouraged spirit. A ten-point proven formula for overcoming discouragement is "Go out and win a soul to Christ." Now, repeat it nine times. This is certain to cure anyone of the blues. (Try it for yourself.) 11. David's Encouragement—Psalm 3:3

A. He was encouraged when he remembered God's help in the past. (STOP! Take a moment to review God's blessings in your own life and be encouraged.) Count your blessings; name them one by one. Count your many blessings; see what God hath done. B. He was encouraged when he remembered God's special love. Consider God's love for you (John 3:16), along with the special love that Christ has for you: (John 15:9.) "As the Father hath loved me, so have I loved you: continue ye in my love."

C. He was encouraged when he remembered God's power and blessings manifest toward him. Any man will overcome his discouragement when he counts his blessings. (Psalm 103:1-14.)

111. David's Prayer—Psalm 3:4 A. He prayed fervently (James 5:16). B. He prayed wholeheartedly (Psalm 119:145).

C. He prayed continually (Psalm 55:17).

William Cooper was on target when he wrote this poem:

Prayer makes the darkest clouds withdraw. Prayer climbs the ladder Jacob saw,

Gives exercise to faith and love, Brings every blessing from above. Restraining prayer we cease to fight; Prayer makes the Christian's armor bright, And Satan trembles when he sees The weakest saint upon his knees.

We do well to remember that whatever the posture of the body, the soul can be on its knees. The only time God is deaf is when we are dumb. The only time He doesn't answer is when we don't ask. (By the way, even the weakest prayer can be heard if you do not live too far from the throne.) His promise is "Call unto me, and I will answer thee, and shew thee great and mighty things, which thou knowest not" (Jeremiah 33:3).

IV. David's Provision—Psalm 3: 5-8 A. Provided rest—verse 5 (Hebrews 4:9) B. Provided strength—verse 5 (Psalm 27:1) C. Provided courage-verse 6 (Joshua 1:6,7) D. Provided victory—verse 7 (I John 5:4) E. Provided salvation—verse 8 (Isaiah 33:2) Rest is assured when one comes to Jesus (Matthew 11:28-30). Strength is found in the God of our refuge (Psalm 46:1). Courage is coupled with strength (Deuteronomy 31:6). Victory is of the Lord (I Chronicles 29:11). Salvation is in a Person, and only in a Person, and only in one Person, and that Person is Jesus Christ, our Lord (Acts 4:12).

#### Summary:

No one can deny that the psalmist was lifted up from the depths of despondency, despair and discouragement when he turned by faith to God. So it is that you can be delivered from the pit of depression when you cry from a sincere heart to the same God (Psalm 40:1-3). His ears are ever open, and you can get His attention at once. A

#### **Concluding Thought:**

The prayer of faith brings God into the drama of a man's life, and when God comes on the stage, all is changed.
