

## IBFI ADDED A HOME MISSIONS CHURCH PLANTING ASPECT!

At the annual May meeting this year, the IBFI established a home missions church planting aspect to its missions program. It mirrors its longstanding commitment to assist church planting missions on the foreign field or those working with cross-cultural peoples. Accordingly, a NBBS graduate can also go out as 1) a home missions church planter to either start churches to turn over to other preachers, or 2) to establish a church in which he will remain as the pastor. In both scenarios, he is able to go on deputation to raise support as an IBFI recommended missionary (just like the foreign or stateside cross-cultural IBFI missionaries). As a long term stateside church planter the support he raises is indefinite. As a church planting pastor his status as an IBFI missionary is for 3 to 5 years while the church is being established.

We are excited to introduce to you our newest IBFI missionaries, Scott and Darla Griffin and Homeless No More. They are the first IBFI missionaries to be recommended to the brethren as stateside church planters. Scott graduated from Norris Bible Baptist Seminary in May 2000. He and Darla have been actively working with the homeless for four years. They are effectively working to start a church for the homeless in Fort Worth and have a vision to have this same type of work multiplied in other cities.

Their ministry offers tremendous opportunities for those in the Fort Worth area to participate in their soul winning and church planting efforts. You can be a part by direct participation and through giving to provide some of the needs in their ministry.

Greetings from the streets of Ft Worth,



### LEST WE FORGET THE ROCK FROM WHICH WE WERE HEWN

As the years come and go, some people are prone to forget the foundation upon which they are built and the rock from which they were hewn. Baptists of every stripe are indebted to J. Frank Norris, the twentieth century's foremost fundamentalist.

I personally have childhood memories of the "man among men" that stem from the days when my dad in the early 1940s engaged the great preacher to conduct Bible conferences in the Baptist Tabernacle in Danville, Virginia, that my dad founded and pastored for more than thirty years.

Upon my graduation from high school, I enrolled in 1950 in the Bible Baptist Seminary in downtown Fort Worth. I was privileged to sit at the feet of Dr. Norris in the classroom as well as chapel services. Then on May 20, 1951, he united Mary Helen and me in marriage in the historic First Baptist Church.

### INDEPENDENT BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP AND NORRIS BIBLE BAPTIST SEMINARY

All who were privileged to attend, enjoyed one of the best fellowship meetings in the thirty-four-year history of the fellowship and seminary. The influence of Dr. Norris permeated the meeting, and the seminary graduation reflected upon his memory. Truly, he being dead yet speaketh.

There would be no IBFI and NBBS had it not been for Dr. Norris' unflinching stand in the 1920s to lift high the banner of fundamentalism, and along with Dr. Lewis Entzminger, establish the Bible Baptist Seminary in 1939.

### TWO GREAT CHURCHES 1,300 MILES APART

For fifteen years (1935-1950), Dr. Norris pastored the First Baptist Church of Fort Worth, Texas, and the Temple Baptist Church of Detroit, Michigan, with a combined membership of over twenty-five thousand. During most of those years, he was building a great seminary and editing a weekly publication that reached a circulation of more than seventy thousand. He did these things while he also traveled throughout America and many parts of the world preaching the gospel of redeeming grace. His influence reached the nation's capital and many other capitals of the world.

The morning meetings were held in the Raymond W. Barber Conference Center. The Wednesday night service was held at the Worth Baptist Church, Fort Worth, Texas. The meeting was well attended by Pastors, Evangelists, Missionaries, Christian workers, and many church members.

The meeting began with our annual J. Frank Norris Memorial Banquet. We know God is going to use them for His glory. The Seminary is experiencing a very healthy growth pattern under the able leadership of our President, Dr. Jonathan Stewart.

It was a great meeting, with amazing fellowship, and the music was inspirational as we sang the great hymns of the faith and enjoyed excellent special music. The music was under the direction of Bro. Andrew Johnson. Musicians who assisted were Madeline Guerrea, Lonnie Shipman and Elvina Shipman. The preaching was great and in keeping with our theme, the Holy Spirit's presence was experienced in a tremendous way.

The next national meeting will be held at the Cornerstone Baptist Temple in Dayton, Ohio. Dr. Jerry Siler is the Pastor. Dr. Siler, the staff and members of Cornerstone are always great hosts, and I know they have some tremendous and exciting plans in store. I encourage you to make plans now to come. We need you and we all need good, encouraging and challenging preaching, and fellowship. ## IN MEMORIUM – DR. DONALD GREGORY, 1929–2018

On the evening of Sunday, May 27, the angels came and bore away the soul of Dr. Donald Gregory, who leaves behind his wife Joyce, of more than sixty years, and three children: Mark, Carla, and Curtis and their families and a host of friends who loved, respected, and honored this great man of God. Don, Helen, and I went through the Bible Baptist Seminary together in the early 1950s. Upon graduation, he went to Dearborn Heights (Detroit), Michigan, and founded the Faith Baptist Church. Don pastored this church for fifty-three years, building one of the great churches in our fundamental Baptist circles.

Brother Gregory served the Independent Baptist Fellowship as president, member of the Board of Directors of the I.B.F.I. and the Norris Bible Baptist Seminary. He became a pillar of the fellowship and the school. He never wavered in his loyalty. Many young preachers looked to him as an example of what a man of God should become.

He led Faith Baptist Church to support all ministries of the fellowship. After he retired, he personally contributed large sums of money to all phases of the IBF.

Helen and I will personally miss him after sixty-eight years of love, friendship, and companionship in the work of Christ. He could say with the Apostle Paul, "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain" (Philippians 1:21).
