

## REMEMBERING DR. BARBER

#### Pastor Heath Hogue

I had the privilege of taking Dr. Barber's Life of Christ class my second year at the Norris Bible Baptist Institute in the Fall of 1993 As a 19-year-old student, I learned that I did not know as much as I thought I did. I remember Dr. Barber telling the class to fold our paper in half, length wise. On the left-hand side of the paper was everything that was expected to be known for the test. On the righthand side of the paper was "nuggets" that we could write down, After many notes and many more "nuggets," I had a completed notebook. It is a notebook I will always cherish

Having the opportunity to attend school and sit under Dr. Barber is an experience I will never forget. I remember him praying, and after he was done he would write down the three point alliterated message he prayed! He also taught us the importance of time management.
One morning, he stood at the pulpit and looked at us for one full
minute. We all thought he forgot what he was going to say. It was eerily quiet, then he said, "You all wasted one minute of your life that you will never get back. You could have opened your Bible; you could have prayed. Instead, it is gone." The memories are so many, but Dr. Barber's presence will always be at the NBBS just as J. Frank Norris's is. Dr. Barber was a mentor and blessing to my life.

The debt of gratitude I owe Dr. Raymond Barber is unpayable. He and Mrs. Barber gave their lives to a group of people who have shaken a city for Christ and impacted every corner of the globe. I have the privilege to serve those people, and I benefit daily from the sacrifice and faithfulness of those who came before me. Dr. Barber was one of the greatest preachers of his generation, a visionary leader of Independent Baptists, a prolific author and poet, and a spiritual father to thousands. What C.H. Spurgeon was to the Metropolitan Tabernacle, and D.L. Moody was to the Moody Church, and Dr. J. Frank Norris was to the First Baptist Church, Dr. Raymond Barber was to Worth Baptist Church.

#### Bro. John Peeples

The first time I heard Raymond W. Barber preach was in 1984. Starting my second year of preparation for the mission field, I was

at the Opening Day Rally and enrolled in the new Norris Bible Baptist Institute. Dr. Barber took the pulpit and emphasized, in a way few preachers can, my need for preparation in the ministry. He quoted J. Frank Norris, "What is needed is a school that teaches the whole English Bible," and continued "Dr. Norris taught us to learn as much of the Bible as we can while we are young, so we can reap the fruits of that knowledge for our entire ministry." That day made an impact on my life and ministry!

As the years passed by, I learned other lessons from Dr. Barber. I learned that life's race is long, and I need to pace myself, and patience puts us in position to continue and finish our course.

Progressing in God's purpose, Dr. Barber's position changed with time. From pastor and president to other roles such as counselor, encourager, and supporter. When the finish line came into view, I watched him press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus. Always a preacher of the Gospel, a faithful servant of Christ, a prayer warrior, a wise counselor, a steadfast supporter, an encourager, and a friend!

I met Dr. Barber in August of 1999. I had never heard anyone preach, with all the Scripture he was able to quote like that before. Through the years, he and Mrs. Barber were a constant Upon graduating in May of 1997, I did not attend any fellowship encouragement to us, especially on the many occasions he and I preached together in IBFI conferences, prophecy

conferences, special days at churches, and even my graduation. He was always welcome to preach at our church.

At my ordination, Dr. Barber asked the hardest question, "Knowing your past, if someone sticks heir finger in your face, can you walk away from the fight?" While there have been some challenging moments, I have kept my word. I appreciate Dr. Barber identifying a potential weakness, and helping to head off a problem. I loved and appreciate Dr.

beginning one thing was unmistakably clear-his love for the Word of God. He was not a man who cared for trends, personal opinions, or polished motivational speeches. Instead, his heartbeat was that young preachers would anchor themselves in the Scriptures and

Dr. Barber reminded us often that our calling was not to impress, but to faithfully proclaim. He believed that the Bible itself was sufficient and powerful, and that Christ alone must be lifted up in our preaching. That conviction shaped not only his own ministry but also the ministries of countless others whom he trained, influenced, and inspired.

Over the decades, Dr. Barber left a lasting mark on several generations of preachers. His voice still echoes in pulpits across the country and beyond, through the men he poured into-men who continue to faithfully "preach the Word" as he charged us to do. His legacy is not only in his own sermons, but in the multiplied ministries of those who took his counsel to heart.

Though Dr. Barber has now gone home to be with the Lord, he loved and served so faithfully, his influence endures. Every time the Bible is opened, Christ is preached, and the Gospel is proclaimed by one of the men he trained, his impact lives on. Truly, his life was a testimony to the power of God's Word and to the centrality of Christ in all things.

clarity, conviction, and compassion, and we are grateful for how the Lord used them.


